The Montana man is convinced that if every builder used just 5 percent more American materials it would create 220,000 jobs.

And, now, thanks to an ABC News broadcast, builders are responding, rallying to buy more products, such as Moen faucets, and the word is spreading through HBA's across the country to get on board.

We have heard from a number of members that they would like to see our association initiate a formal program wherein our builder and remodeler members give a written pledge to utilize a minimum of 5% Made in America products in their homes.

Ron Tetrault of Chace Building Supplies is asking fellow associate members to take inventory of what we buy and sell, and get a list of local resources available together and send to the BAEC office.

# BUILDING BRIEFS II 1

### NAHB Fights Use of Higher Guaranty Fees to Pay for Payroll Tax Cut

As Congress scrambled to come to agreement on a way to extend the payroll tax cut through 2012 before heading home for the holidays, NAHB was fighting extremely hard against a proposal that would help pay for that extension through an increase on guaranty fees charged to banks by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac -- a move that would ultimately raise the price of homeownership for all Americans seeking loans backed by those institutions. As Chairman Bob Nielsen said in an official statement, "Congress is essentially proposing to raise taxes on millions of potential home buyers in order to pay for a payroll tax cut and other non-housing legislative initiatives. With the housing market struggling to regain its footing, such a short-sighted move would be extremely counterproductive and threaten the fragile economic recovery. The guaranty fees (known as g-fees) that Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac charge lenders to protect against credit-related losses should not be used for purposes unrelated to the safety and soundness of the housing finance system." Unfortunately, the House did pass a version of the payroll tax extension legislation that included the g-fee provision earlier this week. However, as of Friday afternoon, the House and Senate were still at an impasse on the bill, and NAHB was aggressively working to delete the g-fee provision from the final

legislative package. Meanwhile, one bright spot in the House-passed legislation was the inclusion of NAHB-supported language to extend the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) for the next five years, and we are seeking to ensure that this particular part of the bill remains intact. In the event that this effort proves unsuccessful, Congress has already agreed to extend the NFIP through the end of May as part of the deal it reached earlier on a \$1 trillion spending bill to keep the federal government up and running into next fall.

The payroll tax cut legislation would keep 160 million workers from seeing their payroll tax jump on Jan. 1 from this year's 4.2% back to its normal level of 6.2% — a \$1,000 difference for a family earning \$50,000.



# U.S and Connecticut Departments of Labor Join Forces to Enforce Wage and Hour Laws on Construction Sites



The Wage and Hour Division of the United States Department of Labor ("US DOL") announced a multi-year enforcement initiative focusing on the construction industry in Connecticut and Rhode Island. . The US DOL intends to remedy what it believes to be systemic violations of the Fair Labor Standards Act ("FLSA") and to

promote contractor and subcontractor compliance with the law.

Since 2008, the US DOL's Hartford Office has conducted 183 investigations in Connecticut and Rhode Island and has recov-

ered almost \$3.3 million in back wages. The US DOL has typically acted in cases in which it believes that employers have misclassified employees as independent contractors to avoid wage and hour laws, paid piece-work rates which resulted in compensation below the minimum wage, and failed to pay overtime compensation.

The Connecticut Department of Labor has also been active in investigating wage and hour compliance at construction sites and has issued stop work orders under Connecticut law.

### **Real Estate Property Condition Disclosure**

The Legislature's Regulations Review Committee is considering an amendment to the state's Department of Consumer Protection Regulations entitled "The Uniform property Condition Disclosure Act" (Connecticut General Statutes Section 20-327b) requiring the seller of residential property to provide a disclosure form to the prospective purchaser prior to the prospective purchaser's execution of any binder, contract to purchase, option or lease containing a purchase option.

These provisions apply to the transfer of residential real property of four dwelling units or less made with or without the assistance of a licensed broker or salesperson. The seller will be required to credit the purchaser with the sum

of \$300 at closing if the seller fails to furnish this report as required by this Act.

Please note that Connecticut law requires the owner of any dwelling in which children under the age of 6 reside to abate or manage materials containing toxic levels of lead.
