PRESDIENT'S MESSAGE WINTER 2014


Members and friends,

Since June - we on the Board of AAFCS/CT - have been involved in a conversation involving the fate of AAFCS and in essence the fate of the Connecticut Affiliate of AAFCS.

The Board of Directors of AAFCS has put in motion steps leading to the creation of the Academy of Family and Consumer Sciences which would become the governing board of the Associations which now make up the AAFCS Alliance.

Members of AAFCS would become Members-at-Large of the Academy of Family and Consumer Sciences. All financial and intellectual assets of AAFCS would be used to create this new Academy. The Board of AAFCS is pushing for a vote at the Annual Meeting in St. Louis at the end of June.
