From points southwest of Norwich (Bridgeport, New Haven, Madison)

Take I-95 to I-395 North to Exit 81E (CT Route 2, a four-lane highway). **At the end of the four-lane highway, turn right at the traffic light onto Washington Street (the William W. Backus Hospital will be on the right). Stay on Washington Street Past Arnold on your left and Fanning Avenue on your right. At the next traffic light - a three-way intersection joining Washington Street (bearing to the right), Carroll Avenue (turning to the extreme left) and Broadway (bearing slightly to the left) - bear left on Broadway. The Norwich Free Academy will be on the left. The north parking lot provides access to the Latham Science & Information Center, Cranston House, Shattuck House, Allis House and Levanto Alumni House. The south parking lot provides access to Tirrell House, Slater Memorial Museum, Bradlaw House/Sidney E. Frank Center for Visual & Performing Arts, Converse Art Building, and the Norton and Alumni Hall Gymnasiums. Limited, marked visitor parking spaces are available in either lot.

From points due west of Norwich (Waterbury, Hartford)

Take I-84 East to Exit 55 (CT Route 2 East) [Follow directions above from **].

From points due north of Norwich (Putnam, Killingly)

Take I-395 South to Exit 81E (CT Route 2 East) [Follow directions above from **].

From points northwest of Norwich (Storrs, Willimantic)

From Storrs, take CT Route 195 towards Willimantic to CT Route 32 South. Soon after passing Modesto's Restaurant (on the right) in North Franklin, merge onto CT Route 2 East and follow this four-lane highway to the end [Follow directions above from **].

From points due south of Norwich (New London)

Follow CT Route 32 North to I-395 North. Take Exit 81E (CT Rt. 2 East) off I-395 [Follow directions above from **].

From points east or southeast of Norwich (Westerly, Groton)

Enter Norwich by way of either CT Route 2 West or CT Route 12 North (which intersects with Route 2 shortly after entering Norwich). Follow Route 2 West through downtown Norwich; Route 2 becomes Washington Street. Follow Washington Street north to Chelsea Parade South (approximately one mile). Turn right onto Chelsea Parade South; you will be facing the NFA's Tirrell and Slater buildings straight ahead. Turn left onto Broadway for NFA's north parking lot or right onto Crescent Street for NFA's south parking lot.
