Vikki and I reviewed who on the meals on wheels list might be in the most need as 95% of Lisbon was without power. I spoke to John Arpin, Lisbon's EMO, we decided to place a hose outside the Senior Center so the public could get water. That was available from 9am to 7pm until Sept 5th. I decided to make a pasta meal on Wed., August 31, so the seniors could gather, have a hot meal and get answers to their questions. Vikki spent a great deal of time delivering meals. getting water for toilet flushing, getting essential groceries for the Senior Center and seniors plus giving out MRE's and drinking water. Joyce Kvist and Heather Jencks helped. The regular schedule for both the Senior Center and the van were suspended. The Senior Center schedule resumed on Wed. and the Van schedule resumed on Sept. 6. As a way to prepare for the next hurricane or winter storm we have been giving out 2 MRE's and 4 bottled waters per person.

Lisbon Senior Center Code of Conduct

All participants and staff should expect to feel welcome and safe. All will be treated with respect. All will be treated with courtesy. This code of conduct applies to all.

Examples of inappropriate behavior:

- Disruptive actions
- offensive, shouting or loud language
- threatening or intimidating behavior or language
- stealing or damage to town property
- any crime, misdemeanor or violation of law
- physical or threatening of physical harm
- sexually explicit language or profanity
- discrimination of any sort

Emergency situations:

Are situations in which an individual's actions are perceived to present imminent danger to the life or safety of others. Such incidents include assault and other crimes of violence, or the threat or attempt to commit such crimes. When such behavior or actions are observed, the police will be called.

In the event law enforcement is involved and charges result in conviction, the individual will be permanently suspended.

Disciplinary Process

1st Occurrence – Verbal warning to include a review of the Code of Conduct and to include possible suggestions of ways to not have the incident occur again.

2nd Occurrence – Warning written and delivered to the individual or group to include a review of number 1 and attach the Code of Conduct

3rd Occurrence – Will result a minimum suspension of 30 days or permanent suspension

Appeal Process

- The individual or group may appeal at any point to the Lisbon Commission on Aging.
- The appeal must be made in writing to the Lisbon Commission on Aging within 10 working days of receiving disciplinary action
- The Lisbon Commission on Aging will notify the individual or group of the appeal meeting date
- The individual or group must attend that Lisbon Commission on Aging meeting
- The individual or group will present their case in person and in writing
- The Lisbon Commission on Aging will make a written report outlining the decisions within 20 working days of the appeal meeting.
