- Similarly, please be mindful of your language - particularly in the grill room.



Greens

For the maintenance department and a few die hard golfers the season has begun. A great week in mid march allowed us to get the majority of the golf course cleaned up from a brutal winter. The golf course is in good shape considering the severity of the winter, the only "damage" I can see is some snow mold on fairways which will grow out with a stretch of warm weather.

I was able to open the greens earlier than ever before this season we opened on March 18. I attribute this to having no frost in the ground because of the excessive snow cover followed by mild temperatures and the improvement in the soil structure i.e. drainage over the last 4 seasons of aggressive aeration and topdressing.

In the weeks ahead we will be addressing bunker sand consistency and quality along with cart path repair. We will be doing this on a tight budget so I will need to address only the most severe problem areas. Bunkers need to have adequate sand depth and drainage, as they age they loose both. We will do our best to make these "hazards" as good as we can, keeping in mind they are hazards not manicured surfaces.

We have begun scouting for our friend the Annual Blue Grass weevil, each year this is one of our most troublesome pests. They are difficult to control, very damaging and have adapted too many of the insecticides commonly used to control them. I set traps for them in areas I know they will show up first, I found my first adult ABW Monday 3/21/11. The data I collect from these traps, combined with weather conditions will give me a precise timing window for application. Every course is different and each season is different their is no set day or marker I can use to target the application so monitoring conditions and insect movement is the only way to effectively control the first generation of these pests. I have seen them go through as many as 4 generations in one season at NLCC, controlling the first effectively will substantially reduce populations there by inhibiting further generations.

We are off to a good start and I am looking forward to a great 2011! Please remember to get updated on course conditions and read articles like this at <u>danrogersgolf.com</u>



Events happening in the month of April:

Tee times will officially begin April 16th, 2011. The bag room and locker rooms will officially be open for the season on April 30, 2011. The first annual Masters Golf and Social will take place on April 9th beginning with a mini shotgun at 10:30 a.m. Social time begins at 2:30 until closing.

The 2011 twilite league will consist of two seven-week halves. The first half will be May 10-June 21. The second half will be June 28-August 9. All play is on Tuesdays with a 5:30 shotgun start. The finals, which consist of the winners of each half, will take place on August 16th. The year-end banquet is August 23 at 7:00 p.m. Sign-ups will be due by April 30th.
