### GREENS By Dan Rogers, Superintendent

It has been a summer of extremes that I will not be sorry to see come to an end. Long periods with no measurable precipitation, then short periods of excessive rain in hot conditions made July and August two of the most challenging months I have experienced in the golf industry. There was a noticeable decline in the condition of the fairways and some greens due to extreme heat and humidity.

Stress caused by heat and humidity resulted in greens becoming highly stressed in the later part of July and early August, root systems declined and turf thinned. In response to this extreme weather I took action to keep from loosing grass. I raised the height of cut, focused on water management to keep failing root systems adequately hydrated but not overly saturated, shortened spray intervals focusing on nutrition. I went on a program alternating root based products to help restore root mass and control soil bourn pathogens. I used foliar products to increase the plants ability to photosynthesize and control foliar diseases thereby alleviating summer stress. The weather we experienced shortened the effectiveness of many chemical products, I had to shorten the spray intervals to compensate and keep up with disease pressure. Green speeds were slower than normal, but the greens recovered and we did not loose much grass, in these situations slow grass is better than no grass.

Thank you for your patience as we nursed the golf course through one of the hottest summers on record, I look forward to the last leg of the golf season and hope the extremes are over.
