The course opened the third week of March with fine conditions. No turf damage occurred during the winter of 2010. Clean-up has begun but will take longer this year due to budget cuts resulting in a smaller staff. The recent heavy rain has caused quite a bit of damage to our already weak infrastructure. We are considering different options and will address the problem soon. Tee and fairway coring have begun and will continue through-out the month. Green aeration is scheduled for the end of April. The regrading and drainage behind 11 green is finished and will be sodded as soon as material is available.

A friendly reminder:

Repair your ball marks and all others you seen on the greens. Replace divots when possible. Rake traps after use. Carts remain on paths and obey signs and rope lines. Carts stay away from greens. Pull carts do not wheel between traps and the green. Stand bags off green and collar into the rough and off tees. Never discard litter on golf course. Mr. Parliament and Mr. Marlboro Light – keep your butts off our golf course.

The staff is working very hard. Your help in these matters is very important. Our course conditions are among the finest in the State and we plan to keep it that way going forward.

GREEN

Welcome back to those of you who have been able to take advantage of some early spring golf between monsoons. We are doing our best to finish up winter projects, complete spring clean up and transition into a normal maintenance schedule. In addition to spring clean up work, I am trying to fix some drainage issues. We have installed 180' of 6" drain line behind the 11<sup>th</sup> green; this should eliminate the wet area behind the left trap. I plan to install a 200' drain line on the right side of the 9<sup>th</sup> men's tee and I will be able to connect that line to the newly installed line behind the 11<sup>th</sup> green. I discovered a clogged main 8" drain line in the fescue right of the 13<sup>th</sup> hole. The cause of this clog was the roots of a large Japanese maple. Trees have a remarkable ability to find water. The roots of this tree made their way into this 8" perforated pipe and almost completely filled 60' of pipe with fibrous roots. I will be replacing that perforated pipe with solid pipe so this does not happen in the future.

Due to budget cut-backs, the maintenance crew will be raking bunkers on a set schedule.

It is imperative that all golfers show consideration and remember their responsibility to rake bunkers. Thanks for your patience as we prepare the course for 2010. I look forward to seeing everyone out enjoying the course and the warm weather to come.
