From Our Kitchen To Yours

Frozen Yogurt Covered Blueberries Serves 2

Ingredients:

- 1 (6 oz) Container of fresh blueberries
- 1 (6 oz) container nonfat blueberry Greek yogurt.

NOTE: Honey, vanilla and strawberry can all be used and are delicious!

Instructions:

- 1. Start by washing your blueberries and lining a small baking sheet with parchment or wax paper.
- 2. Using a toothpick, dip each blueberry into the Greek yogurt and swirl until the blueberry is nicely coated with yogurt. Place on baking sheet. Continue this until all blueberries are coated.
- 3. Place baking sheet into freezer, and let freeze for at least an hour.
- 4. After about an hour, your Frozen Yogurt Covered Blueberries can be placed in a ziplock baggie and stored in the freezer. Take out what you need for snack time and enjoy!



Self-Advocacy Talk

A Word From Our Self Advocacy Coordinator:

The Self-advocacy group has been extremely busy with very interesting guest speakers. In April we had Beth Regan, who is a Native American of the Mohegan Tribe. She wore her regalia which shows they are proud of who they are and of their heritage. Other items of her regalia were a medicine wheel, a decorative walking stick and a turtle pouch, all of which she described in detail. She talked about how they have had to advocate for themselves for many years. We were all very inspired.



In June four Self-advocates from our group attended the annual People First Statewide Conference in Meriden. Our keynote speaker was Lydia Brown who spoke about a variety of topics regarding violence against people with disabilities, celebrating who we are and a broad spectrum of issues affecting people with disabilities such as rights, inclusion and self-determination. A great day was had by all.

I continue to advocate at the state level in Hartford by writing letters and e-mailing our legislators and the Governor's office asking them to restore the cuts to the DDS budget. Our advocacy worked as the DDS final approved budget was spared the severest cuts proposed by the Governor. I'm fighting hard to protect the "safety net" and remind legislators that "all people matter."
