#### Are You Interested in Getting Involved with The Arc??



## From Our Kitchen To Yours

## Mini Frozen Yogurt Pops

#### **Ingredients:**

- 16 oz. fresh strawberries, hulled/halved
- Four (4 oz.) cups strawberry yogurt
- Four (4 oz.) cups berry yogurt
- 6 oz. fresh blueberries
- Ice cube trays
- Mini craft sticks

#### **Instructions:**

Place about 3/4 of the strawberries in a blender. Add all strawberry yogurt and pulse a few times to chop the fruit.

Spoon into ice cube trays.

Rinse out blender and place the remaining strawberries and all blueberries in the blender with all berry yogurt. Pulse a few times to choose the fruit

Spoon into ice cube trays.

Cover ice cube trays with aluminum foil and press down so you can see the outline of the trays.

Take a mini craft stick and poke through the aluminum foil and into the center of the pop (the aluminum will hold the stick in place until pops are frozen.)

Place in freezer and freeze until solid. (Approximately 4 hours)
