From Our Kitchen To Yours

Tomato-Tortellini Soup

Ingredients:

- **2** 14 1/2 ounce cans reduced-sodium Chicken broth or vegetable broth
 - 1 9 ounce package refrigerated cheese-filled tortellini
 - 1/2 of an 8-ounce tub cream cheese spread with chive and onion
- 1 10.75 ounce can condensed tomato bisque soup

Directions:

In a medium saucepan bring broth to a boil. Stir in tortellini. Return to boiling then reduce heat. Simmer, uncovered, for 5 minutes.

Gradually whisk about 1/3 cup of the hot broth into cream cheese spread until smooth. Stir cream cheese mixture into broth in saucepan. Gradually stir in tomato soup; heat through. If desired, sprinkle each serving with chives.
