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#### Background

The Writer's Block Ink was started in 2003 to encourage youth to use writing and performance as tools to address personal and social challenges on the community stage. Students from The Block (ages 10-19) create original performances with a strong emphasis on spoken word poetry and perform on stages across Southeastern Connecticut. Taking their pens and feet from their heads and hearts to the streets, members of the Block produce powerful lyrics and choreography that provide insight and perspective into the challenges and choices they encounter each day. Final Writer's Block productions are written, choreographed, run, advertised and performed by students. Writer's Block workshops, performance programs, open mics and poetry slams are available to schools and community organizations. Courses are structured to guide students to improve writing skills, build self-confidence, leadership and teamwork. The students conceive an idea, develop a plot, evaluate character conflict, cast themselves, write a final script, market, and ultimately perform their work for the community.

### **Situation Analysis**

The opportunities for teens to participate in activities which build self-esteem while providing a constructive environment emphasizing academic support, teamwork and socialization opportunities through theater are limited. The Block intends to fill that void. We provide opportunities for teens to conceive, write, perform, direct, and produce original plays. The Block teaches and practices all aspects of theater. Specifically team work, writing skills, performance techniques, dance, set design, marketing, contracts, copyrights, advertising, budget management, fund raising, and personal and community commitment.

#### **Demographics**

Our roots are in the students, many of whom are first-generation college bound minorities. Our program is open to everyone, we find talent comes from all groups and we intend to continue to diversify our talent pool. Objectives:

- 1. Sustain a safe, nurturing, and productive environment for youth to use writing and performance techniques to address social challenges.
- 2. Build and strengthen self-confidence, leadership, interpersonal, and professional communication and performance skills.
- 3. Supplement academic curriculum by reinforcing English, Business, and Social skills.
- 4. Create performance opportunities to engage youth with their communities.
- 5. Involve the local community by networking with local schools, businesses and arts institutions.
- 6. Help students learn to market their writing and performance skills to achieve personal goals and become successful leaders and citizens.
